

NATIONAL LIBRARY OF MEDICINE NLM PUBMED MEDLINE: TRY IT! http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/sites/entrez.

- PubMed Medline is the first choice for health information. Freely available
 at home or in the office, it is a database with millions of citations to articles
 covering both clinical and health administration research. Some of the
 articles are free full text; others are easily obtainable through the Joseph
 Brant Library system.
- Articles selected can be saved to *Clipboard* and emailed.
- Note that *Single Citation Matcher* is very useful if you are tracing an incomplete or incorrect citation.
